International Aid Trust support a Nurse and a Midwife based at New Hope School, Lungi, Sierra Leone. They support very poor local communities without access to healthcare. They also visit other villages regularly to hold free clinics.



In Sierra Leone up to 1 in 6 women still die in child birth, Having access to free ante-natal and post- natal health care makes a huge difference.

Diseases such as malaria and typhoid are common place, as is malnutrition especially amongst children.



Health education talks are also given at outreach clinics and are helping mothers to keep their children healthy.

Deacon evangelists from New Hope Church visit the villages regularly with Marion (Midwife) and Rebecca (Nurse). The good news of the gospel is shared alongside practical help and local people are coming to know Jesus for themselves.
