


Hello everybody, Archie Office Dog here! Would you like to join me finding out more about International Aid Trust?





For receivers – that someone cares about their situation and wants to send things to help, means so much to people in great need.




- gift wrap your shoebox and lid separately, fasten with an elastic band and label your boxes with age and boy / girl.

Make your own bunting flags

- Cut round this outline, then draw round it and cut out triangles on paper or fabric, at least 1 for each of the countries we've visited.
- Draw, paint or collage on your triangles: on each one include pictures, shapes and colours that make you think of that country.
- Sew or glue your flags onto string or ribbon.
- Hang your flags somewhere you'll see them often, you could use them as a reminder to think about and pray for the people in that country and the charity's work there.
