In this pack are:

- 1) the calendar of prayer points for each day.
- 2) the pictures to cut out, colour and put together to create a Bethlehem scene.

How to use this reflection:

- For each day there is a Bible verse and thought to reflect on or an area of our work to pray.
- Create your background: take an A3 sheet of card or paper (or stick 2 A4s together). Make the top half dark blue for the sky –you could dot in some small stars in white. Make the bottom half sandy colour you might want to slope this us to a hill in the centre.
- You could choose to add a part of the background, Bethlehem scene or characters to the picture each day, or put the picture together in 1 go. Some of the pictures to colour relate directly to the reflection for a particular day, these are labelled
- Use your imagination! How you colour / paint / decorate each part and how you arrange them is up to you!
- Please adapt and use this resource as it works for you it can be done alone, with a child or as a family day by day; or as a group who meet weekly praying for those 7 areas at one meeting, or with a larger group at 1 meeting.
- The images are designed to fill an A3 sheet, but you can photocopy them larger to create a bigger finished picture.





Here is an example of how all the pictures could fit together to form a Bethlehem scene, but it's great if you want to arrange differently, or to use felt pens / pastels /collage or other materials.

December Daily Reflection and Prayer

1) Mark 2 v 6

'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.'

As you create your background for the Bethlehem scene, take time to think about this prophecy of Jesus's birth.

5) Luke 2 v: 1 - 5 'In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ... So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child.' Take time to think about their 90 mile journey.

9) Luke 2 v 10:

'I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people ...' Give thanks and pray for all who share the good news, like Pastor Ruslan and his team of volunteers at the Prison Ministry in Odessa, who share the gospel and give prisoners hope of new life in Jesus. 2) Give thanks for our Shoebox scheme, that these small boxes bring so much joy to the people who receive them. Please pray for everyone who receives a shoebox this year, that this gift will point them to God's greatest gift of his Son



6) Give thanks for our Midwife Marion and Nurse Rebecca in Sierra Leone, travelling to villages and supporting new and expectant mums. Pray for safe deliveries, healthy mums and babies.



10) Give thanks for Pastor Igor and all the volunteers from Klekhivka Church who are sharing the gospel and planting churches in neighbouring villages such as Gvardiyske. Pray for local people to receive the Good News with joy. **3)** Give thanks for everyone who fills shoeboxes, and for those who co-ordinate their group, church or school's part in the shoebox scheme. Please pray that they will be blessed by blessing people in need.



4) Give thanks that our new warehouse is operational at Lostock Hall. Please pray for the loads being put together to be sent to
 Eastern Europe

astern Europe: and to Sierra Leone.

7) Give thanks for the free health camps that our team in India are able to organise and the Christian doctors, dentists and nurses who so generously give their time. Pray that they will be a great blessing to

people who can't afford health care.



 8) Give thanks for the Hands of Dorcas Tailoring training that takes place in different ways in India, Sierra Leone and Ukraine. Pray that the skills that the women are learning would help them to provide for their families and also bring dignity and hope for the future.

11) Give thanks for our Ukraine Director Pastor Pasha and volunteers from Kyiv churches who travel over to support the outreach in rural villages. Pray for safe travels, energy and encouragement.

12) Luke 2v 15

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

Take time to think about the Shepherd's amazement and joy as they hurried to Bethlehem.

13) Give thanks for Bishop Kota, our Director in India and all the Pastors who travel to villages to share the gospel with people who otherwise wouldn't hear about Jesus. Please pray for protection from persecution and for villagers to accept Jesus.

17) Give thanks for Pastor Victor and team in Moldova, serving very poor rural villages. Please pray for them as they support people practically and spiritually.



21) Give thanks for our CEO and Founder Bernard and all our Trustees, pray for God's wisdom and guidance in their leadership of the charity.

14) Give thanks for Living Hope School and Little Buds School in India providing a good education in a caring Christian environment. Please pray for all the staff and children.



18) Give thanks for our partnership with Prison Fellowship Romania, in Transylvania. Please pray for Director Andrei and team as they support very marginalised Roma communities, as well as prisoners and their families.

22) Give thanks for all our dedicated UK managers and staff in the office, warehouse and charity shops. Pray for God's help and wisdom for them in every situation.



15) Give thanks for New Hope School in Sierra Leone, where children are enjoying learning, their free school lunch and getting to know Jesus. Please pray for the plans for a secondary school.



16)Give thanks for Pastor Michael and Alice, our Director and Headteacher in Sierra Leone and the evangelists from New Hope Church who travel to villages to share the gospel. Please pray that they will see more and more people giving their lives to Jesus.
